1. Separable vs. Non-Separable Phrasal Verbs

Separable Phrasal Verbs

These phrasal verbs allow the object to come between the verb and the particle. If the object is a pronoun, it must come between the verb and the particle.

• Examples:

- o I turned *on* the light.
- o I turned it on. (With a pronoun, "it" must come between "turn" and "on.")

Non-Separable Phrasal Verbs

These phrasal verbs do not allow the object to come between the verb and the particle. The object always follows the whole phrasal verb.

• Examples:

- o She ran *into* an old friend.
- o She ran *into* him. (No separation of "ran" and "into.")

2. Literal vs. Idiomatic Phrasal Verbs

Literal Phrasal Verbs

These are phrasal verbs where the meaning of the verb and particle together is the same as the meanings of the individual words.

• Examples:

- o *Pick up* the book. (literal: physically pick something up)
- Look after your belongings. (literal: take care of them)

Idiomatic Phrasal Verbs

These phrasal verbs have a meaning that is different from the individual meanings of the verb and the particle.

• Examples:

- o Give up smoking. (idiomatic: stop doing something)
- o Run out of time. (idiomatic: finish something completely)

3. Transitive vs. Intransitive Phrasal Verbs

Transitive Phrasal Verbs

These phrasal verbs need a direct object to make sense. You cannot use them without an object.

• Examples:

- o *Turn off* the lights. ("The lights" is the object)
- o *Call back* the client.

Intransitive Phrasal Verbs

These phrasal verbs do not need a direct object. They make sense on their own.

• Examples:

- o The plane *took off.* (No object required)
- o He grew up quickly.
